# Training offer 2014-2015

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## Programming for the 21st century classroom

13-17 October 2014

Programming and computational thinking skills are becoming ever more important in our society and working life. Learning to code develops various skills such as problem-solving, logical reasoning and creativity, and can help student motivation in mathematics theory as it encourages them to apply their knowledge. Schools are key players in introducing programming to students in an engaging way, and help defuse negative stereotypes around computer science. During the course teachers will learn about the importance of programming in today's society and education, learn ways to introduce programming in cross-curricular work, discover and test different programming tools, explore ways to motivate and encourage students, and develop a programming lesson plan for their classrooms. ## Collaboration and innovative learning scenarios

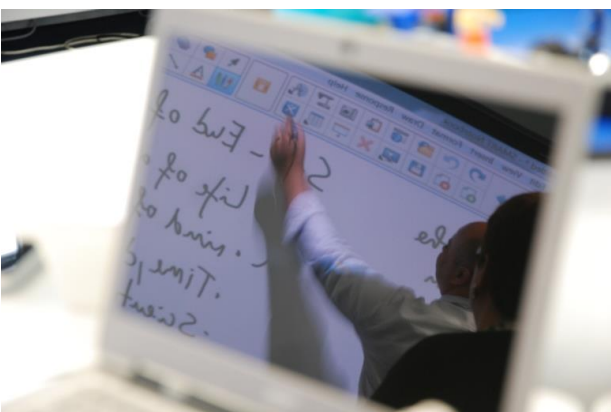
30 March – 3 April 2015

The course is designed to give a hands-on approach for teachers to develop their collaborative classrooms and innovative learning scenarios. The participants will explore a range of tools and ideas that help them to promote collaborative and team work among students and to integrate ICT into their teaching practice in a collaborative and sustainable way. The participants will also develop and analyse visions for the future classroom, and collaborate on the development of innovative Future Classroom Scenarios based on trends and challenges in society and technology.

## Interactive technologies for the future classroom

29 June – 3 July 2015

The participants will learn in this course tools and methodologies to increase and enhance the level of interaction in the classroom. The pedagogically-oriented course addresses topics like student collaboration, freeware for brainstorming and mapping of students' pre-knowledge, interactive whiteboards (IWB) and using different widgets with them, creating interactive exercises and Bring Your Own Device (BYOD).



## Creative use of multimedia, games and tablets in school

*(no date planned)*

The course will show teachers how to use multimedia and devices creatively in the classroom. This workshop is designed to help teachers become proficient in exploring how different media can be used in education. The participants will develop the skills required in order to make innovative use of digital text, audio, images, video and games in their classrooms. The participants will also explore how tablets or other portable devices can be used to enhance interactivity in a classroom and used for group work and as a personalised learning tool.

All courses will be organised in English. Therefore, the participants need to be fluent in English (both oral comprehension and speaking) to follow and participate in the course actively.

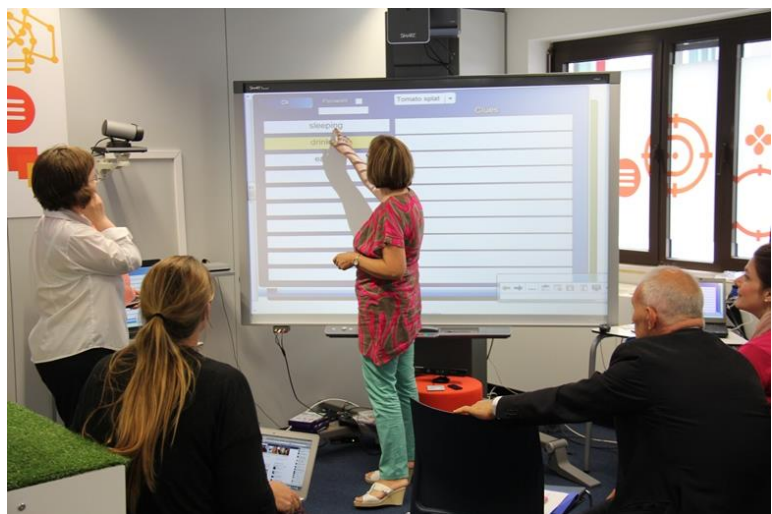
### Workshop fees

## Funding opportunities: Erasmus+

The new EU programme, Erasmus+, offers funding opportunities for schools interested to invest in their teachers' professional development (see: Erasmus+ / Key Action 1 / School education staff mobility). Individuals cannot apply directly for grants, but the application must be done by their organisation: pre-primary, primary, and secondary schools located in EU countries, Liechtenstein, Norway, Turkey, Iceland, FYROM or Switzerland can apply for this funding. The deadline to submit the funding application this year is **17 March 2014, at 12:00h** Central European Time.

### How to apply

First of all, read carefully all information provided on your [National Agency](#) website regarding the Key Action 1.

1. Register your organisation on [European Commission Authentication Service \(ECAS\)](#), if not registered earlier.
2. Obtain your Participant Identification Code (PIC): log in to the [Participant Portal](#) with your ECAS account details, and there register your organisation on the Unique Registration Facility (URF).
3. Download the application form: [Key Action 1 - school education staff mobility](#). Save it on your local computer.
4. Pay special attention on the "European Development Plan" as part of the application form.
5. Use the [Distance Calculator](#) to calculate travel costs for your project.
6. Submit your application online according to the instructions given by your National Agency.

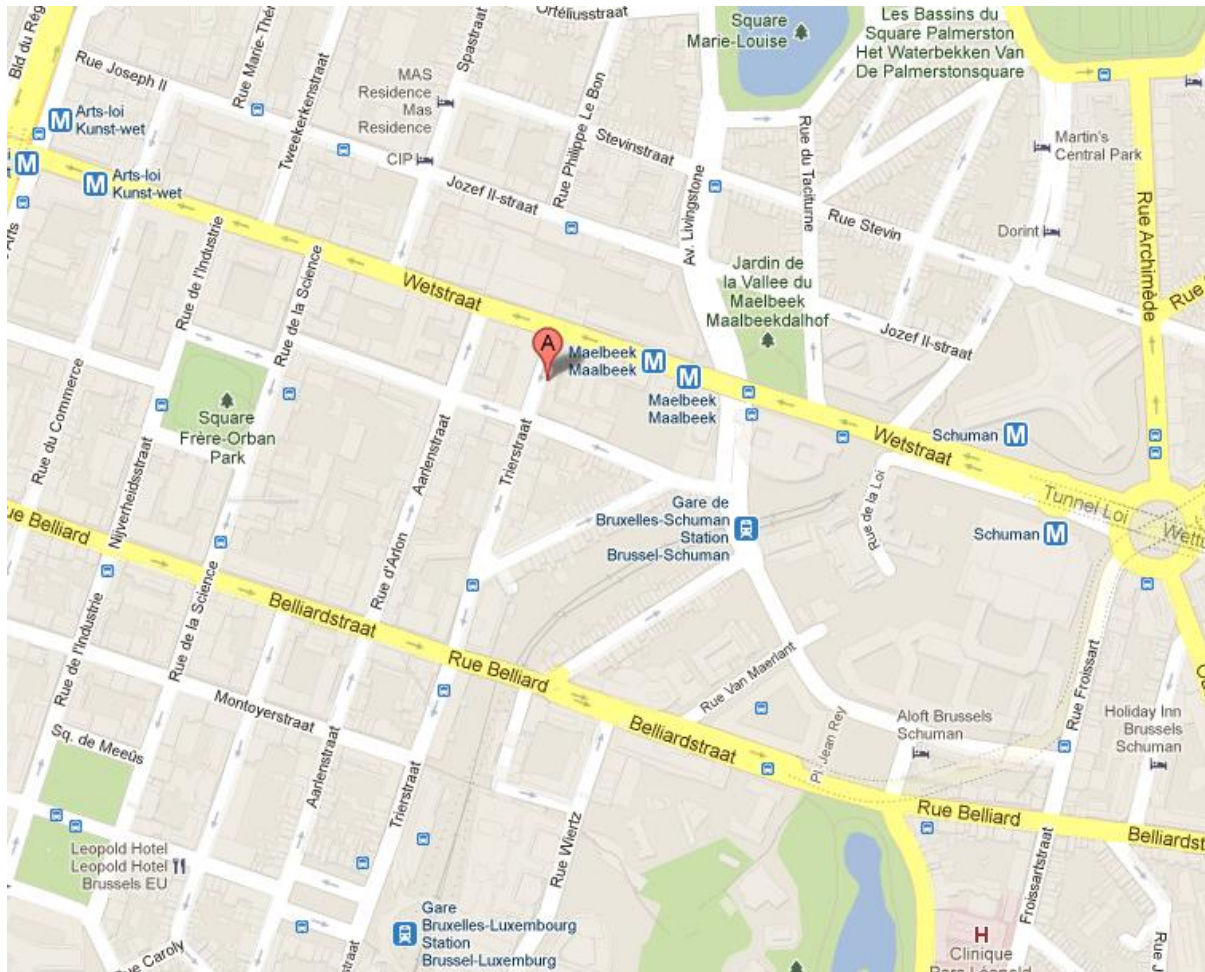

## Travel and insurance

Travel expenses are not covered by the course fee. The courses start at 9:30h on the first day, and therefore the participants should travel to Brussels the day before. The workshops end around 15:00h on the last day so the travel back home should be arranged at 17:00h or after. Before booking your travels, contact the organisers to check if the workshop will run (if there are enough participants).

We ask the participants to confirm they have health insurance that is internationally valid during their stay in Brussels. EU citizens can obtain a free European Health Insurance Card (EHIC).

## Evening program / Cultural visits

We will provide some evening program on some of the course days, e.g. visiting the historical centre or the European Institutions depending on the participants' interests. More information on the evening program will be provided closer to the course.

## Participants' cancellation policy

If the cancellation is done at least 4 weeks before the course begins, there won't be any charges. If the cancellation is done 4-2 weeks before the course starts, 50% of the course fee will be charged. If the cancellation is done less than 2 weeks before the workshop starts, the full cost will be charged. Substitutions are possible right up to the start of the workshop.
